Graduation Requirements

To meet the requirements for graduation, a student shall have attained an approved attendance, conduct, and subject matter record which covers a planned program of education, and such record shall be kept on file in the high school.

The program of studies shall include areas and content in these areas within State Board of Education Regulations and shall be flexible enough to facilitate progress from one stage of development to another, thus providing for more effective student adjustment.

The pattern of courses which shall be required of all students in grades nine (9) through twelve (12) shall be in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the State Board of Education and the Department of Education.

Before high school graduation, every student shall:

- 1. Achieve the specified units of credit;
- 2. Take the required End of Course exams;
- 3. Have satisfactory records of attendance and conduct;
- 4. Take the ACT or SAT in the 11th grade; and
- 5. Successfully complete a United States civics test.

SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENTS

Special education students who successfully complete their Individualized Education Program (IEP), pass the required courses and/or assessments, and have satisfactory records of attendance and conduct shall be awarded a regular diploma. A special education diploma shall be awarded to students who have satisfactorily completed their IEP and who have satisfactory records of attendance and conduct, but who have not met the course and/or assessment requirements. ¹

Special education students who do not meet the requirements for a high school diploma may be awarded an occupational diploma if the student has:²

- 1. Satisfactorily completed their IEP;
- 2. Maintained satisfactory records of attendance and conduct;
- 3. Completed the occupational diploma Skills, Knowledge, and Experience Mastery Assessment (SKEMA);
- 4. Completed at least four (4) years of high school; and
- 5. Has two (2) years of paid or non-paid work experience.

1 The decision to attain an occupational diploma shall be made at the conclusion of the student's tenth (10th) grade year, or two (2) academic years prior to the expected graduation date. Students 2 who have received an occupational diploma shall continue to make progress towards a high 3 4 school diploma until the end of the school year in which they turn twenty-two (22) years old. 5 6 Special education students who do not meet the requirements for a high school diploma may be 7 awarded an Alternate Academic Diploma as another alternative. Attainment of the Alternate 8 Academic Diploma shall be subject to the guidelines set forth by the State Department of Education and/or the State Board of Education. 9 10 11 STUDENT LOAD 12 13 All students in grades nine (9) through twelve (12) shall be enrolled each semester in subjects that will produce a minimum of five (5) units of credit for graduation per year.
